
Summer Office Hours

To keep your students spot for the 2021-22 school year the registration fee must be paid in FULL by August 1st. Payments can be made anytime between now and August 1.




4th Quarter Worship Offerings

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LEAP News Nugget Education Board Best Practices Promoted and Advanced through LEAP

When the Lutheran Education Advancement Plan (*LEAP*) was brought into being in 2009 and 2010 by representatives of the Great Lakes Bay Region LCMS Lutheran Schools, a considerable number of thrusts/studies/plans were imagined and then addressed under the auspices of *LEAP*. One of these which "caught on" and which actively continues is touted in a ten-page *LEAP* document listing 56 "Best Practices of Boards of Education (or Equivalent Governing Entities) of Lutheran Schools." The most recent edition of this document is dated July, 2018, and an electronic copy of the document is available at the *LEAP* Alliance website. To examine it, go to "LEAP-alliance.com," select "Resources," and then download "LEAP Best Practices of Boards of Education" (pdf).

Associated with the *LEAP* "Best Practices of Boards of Education" have been six mealtime "Education Board Training "LEAP-Shop" sessions which brought together Lutheran schools education board members and school leaders for presentations and sharing . . . at various places and times during 2014 through 2018. Another Education Board Training *LEAP-Shop* slated for 2020 was twice postponed due to COVID restrictions. Now it is time to watch for forthcoming news of a 2021 fall Education Board Training *LEAP-Shop* to occur at Valley Lutheran High School!

There is also associated with the *LEAP* Education Board Best Practices encouragement to our area Lutheran education board members to engage in "self-evaluation" of their individual boards, using a self-assessment Instrument drawn directly from the "LEAP Best Practices Document." To date, at least seven of our area Lutheran schools have formally participated in such "self-evaluation." An electronic copy of the self-evaluation instrument is available at the *LEAP* Alliance website ("LEAP-alliance.com"). To examine it, select "Resources," and then download "LEAP Boards of Education Self-Assessment Instrument" (pdf).
